

What makes a house a specific architectural style?

Here is what to look for!

Körner's Folly

Eccentric Victorian Architecture with elements of the Italianate Gothic style

- Expansive porches
- Steeply pitched roofs
- Italianate brick corbelling
- Semi-circular or pointed brick arches
- Absence of large windows

Kernersville Moravian Church

Traditional/Vernacular Style Church

- Moravian hood
- Steeple
- Körner family plot in the cemetery

Henry C. Körner House

Queen Anne Cottage Architecture from the Arts & Crafts movement

- Decorative shingles in pediment
- Decorative hood
- Turned entrance posts
- Tall, double-hung windows

Nathaniel Macon Kerner House

Greek Revival-Influenced Architecture

- Large six-over-six windows
- Columned and pedimented gable front entrance porch
- Gable roof

Rephelius Byron Kerner House

Italianate-Influenced Architecture

- Segmental-arched windows with decorative brick crown
- Chamfered posts
- Tall, narrow, arched door with a beveled oval glass
- Deep molded cornice with gable-end returns

What is a Local Historic Landmark?

In North Carolina, a local historic landmark is a property designated by the appropriate governing board for its special historical, pre-historical, architectural, or cultural significance, possessing integrity of design, setting, workmanship, materials, feeling, and association.

Landmark designation signifies recognition that the property is important to the heritage and character of the community and that its protection enriches all the community's residents.
